**Happy last days of July and first days of August!**

As with most weeks, this upcoming week has a number of saints that we will celebrate. This Monday is July 29th. On Monday the Church celebrates Mary, Martha and Lazarus. You might recall that this family had a special friendship with Jesus. When Lazarus died, Jesus wept and raised him up from the dead. With this family we also have the account of Martha working busily to serve the Lord and Mary sitting at his feet listening to him. In this one event we see the two sides of life. One is service and the other is prayer. Martha was preparing things for the meal and Mary was speaking and listening to Christ, while sitting at his feet. Jesus values both ways of life, but he makes it clear that prayer is the most important of the two. In service and prayer we see the two great commandments of God at work. We are to love God first and to love our neighbor second. In both we love, but love of God is first.

Wednesday is July 31st. On July 31st we celebrate St. Ignatius of Loyola. There are three major things that St. Ignatius is famous for. First is his conversion. After being wounded in the leg in battle, he found himself reading while he was recovering. This reading of the life of Christ and the lives of the saints led him to desire to be a saint. So this shows us the great importance of spiritual reading. It will lead us to great holiness. Second is his Spiritual Exercises. Through his sufferings and prayer Saint Ignatius drew up some Spiritual Exercises. Through these exercises one comes to focus on God alone and the best way in which we can give our lives over to him as the individuals that we are. Third, he founded the Society of Jesus, commonly known as the Jesuits. This religious order has done much good for the world through its missionary and teaching activities. (As an interesting aside, Pope Francis was a priest with the Society of Jesus before he became Pope. Pope Francis is also the first Jesuit to ever become Pope.)

On Thursday, August 1, we celebrate St. Alphonsus De Liguori. St. Alphonsus is the patron saint of moral theology. Moral theology is extremely important in all of our lives even though we may have never really thought of it specifically. Moral theology is the study of what is the right thing to do in a situation. We make our moral decisions based on the use of our reason and divine revelation. There have been many theologians and saints who have written on and given instructions in moral theology. However, St. Alphonsus had a very special gift for this and so is considered the patron saint of moral theology. Celebrating his holiness and his dedication to moral theology should inspire us to delve more deeply into what is the right way to live our lives, so that we can live virtuously, be happy and ultimately go to heaven.

If possible, it is a good thing to attend daily Mass. If you can make it to Mass to celebrate any of these particular days this week, I encourage you to do so. As we pay attention to the liturgical celebrations of the Church each day, our life becomes richer and more well-rounded.
